#### FROM THE PRINCIPAL'S DESK

(Part 5 of my synopsis of 12 Huge Mistakes Parents Can Avoid - Leading Your Kids to Succeed in Life by Dr. Tim Elmore)

Mistake #4: We are inconsistent. No matter how well you've selected your rules, how much you praise your kids, or how effectively you discipline them, you must be consistent, or your efforts will be in vain and your household (or classroom) will still be in crisis. Kids need consistency to get the message because your actions speak louder than your words - it's part of how they're wired. When we are inconsistent, we send mixed signals and breed insecurity and instability in our kids.

Emotionally speaking, consistency makes kids feel safe. When they know what to expect, they feel secure. Clear boundaries, steady consequences, reliable rewards, and the assurance that they can count on you like a sunrise each morning. These things provide the security, safety, and stability your children need.

We are also inconsistent when we tell our children to do something but don't check to see that it's been done. Not every child or teenager needs strict accountability, but most do. It is in our human/sinful nature to push boundaries and test limits. If we don't hold them accountable to do what we've requested or what they've agreed to do, we harm their development.

Instead of reacting inconsistently, try setting up a standard equation. Whenever you kids act up or talk back in a certain way, they lose some phone/tablet privileges or have a new curfew time. Setting up equations and consequences for all will reduce inconsistency and make the environment more calm and predictable.



- 3) Asbestos Jason has a high level cost estimate to remove the tile in the old gym. The cost would be between \$1.25 \$2.50 per square foot over about 2700 square feet for a total between \$3000 and \$7000. It would cost about \$5.00 per square foot if we need it done without advance scheduling.
- 4) Inspections hood, alarms and fire extinguishers have been inspected. All of the fire extinguishers need to be replaced because they are about to expire.
- 5) Carpets there are a lot of water marks on the carpet. Nichole will ask the janitorial company to clean a test patch. If they can make the marks go away, we will hire them to clean the carpet. We need to know that we have the water issues mitigated before we consider replacing the carpet.
- 6) Tiling we know that we have plugged tile and need clear it. Justin is working with Roy Becker on the problem.
- 7) Parking Lot a lot of rock was washed into the yard. J will bring his skid loader over before Brunch to put the rock back

- 2) Fund Raiser looking at having a tournament of some sort to raise funds. It would not be an IDE event so we can draw lots of teams from around the area.
