FROM THE PRINCIPAL'S DESK

(Part 8 of my synopsis of 12 Huge Mistakes Parents Can Avoid - Leading Your Kids to Succeed in Life by Dr. Tim Elmore)

Mistake #7: We won't let them struggle or fight. When we eliminate challenges and difficulties from their lives, kids are conditioned to give up easily without trying. When we do what seems natural - intervene and remove the struggle from our kids' lives - we actually create worse struggles from them later. This parenting mistake can hinder kids from learning how to get along with others, as well as making them prone to become depressed, feel less competent to manage life, and live less satisfied lives. Kids are growing up in a world that is very different from the one we grew up in. Both teachers and parents have changed the way they approach leading students. Some of these changes are great, but some have unintended consequences.

Here is how to correct 4 mistakes we make with kids:

- Adults won't let kids fail. To fix it, identify opportunities to allow your young
 person to take calculated risks and experience failure on a project or in class.
 Coach them but don't intervene and do it for them. Let them build that emotional
 muscle that is capable of enduring failure and seeing that they can live through it.
- 2. Adults won't let kids fall. To fix it, don't rescue kids from all harm. Guide them, coach them, and advise them on how to handle difficult times but allow them the struggle of working their way through the process. No pain, no gain.
- 3. Adults won't let kids fear. To fix it, tell your kids and show them how to face fears. Pick a fear they have and help them create a plan to overcome it.
- 4. Adults won't let kids fight (meaning struggle). To fix it, pause and think before you remove hardship from your kids' lives. When they face conflict or adversity, don't remove it. Talk them through it. Encourage them that they have what it takes to overcome it.



this fall but the option we need to take is not apparent. Jared Stein is willing to put a gutter along
the backside of the building for \$450 to run all of the water to the north end of the addition.
