FROM THE PRINCIPAL'S DESK

(Part 14 of 14 - My synopsis of 12 Huge Mistakes Parents Can Avoid - Leading Your Kids to Succeed in Life by Dr. Tim Elmore)

While reading through the 12 mistakes parents can avoid, Dr. Elmore consistently suggested that we need to change our minds about how we raise kids. If we plan on releasing well-adjusted young adults into the world, we must do some adjusting ourselves, focusing on preparing them and not just protecting them. Dr. Elmore asks "How do you handle risk? Do you tend to resort to rescuing, raving, or offering rewards?" We need a new strategy - a plan for how we parent, lead, teach, and coach our children. And it needs to focus on the future, not just the right now. We need to worry less about today's happiness and more about tomorrow's readiness. We have to change our minds about how we lead our kids. Instead of making the 12 mistakes that Dr. Elmore listed in the book, how about we trade them in for some healthy leadership and long-term love?

- 1. Permit them to try on their own and fail, and then help them see the value of failure.
- 2. Find your identity in something other than your kids so you can find pleasure in them becoming who they are wired to become.
- 3. Communicate with your kids that happiness is a byproduct of using their gifts in service to others.
- 4. Determine the values you want to embody and be firm, steady, and clear as you all live by them.
- As your kids make decisions, allow them to experience the outcomes of those choices either good or bad.
- 6. Rather than spouting random compliments, help your kids identify their strengths, and then reinforce the development of those gifts.
- 7. Don't step in and rescue your kids from working through difficult situations. Instead, talk them through, helping them to grow on the way.
- 8. Provide opportunities for your kids to work, achieve goals, and earn some money so they can learn to delay gratification.
- 9. Affirm the qualities that are in your kids' control, such as honesty or effort, instead of smarts or beauty.
- 10. Instead of automatically eliminating pain, comfort your kids, but help them see how pain can improve them.
- 11. When opportunities arise for your kids to work or correct a problem, be a guide and not a god. Let them do it themselves.
- 12. Makes decisions with a long-term perspective. You are preparing future adults.

WHAT IS SCRIP?

Here's how our SCRIP program works. The school purchases SCRIP (or gift cards) at a discount from national SCRIP vendors. Then we resell the gift cards to the public at face value, which is exactly the same amount you'd pay at the store. The only difference is that the school will profit when you buy gift cards from SCRIP. The school's portion of the profit is the difference between the discounted purchase price and the face value purchase price.

SCRIP is available from most national retailers (JC Penney, Target, Wal-Mart, Kohls, etc.) and from several local retailers (Ced-Rel, Texas Roadhouse, Cassill Motors, etc.) You may also purchase SCRIP gift certificates, so that the recipient can choose the SCRIP he or she uses most. You know you have to go shopping, so why not purchase the SCRIP from the places you're going to go to anyway? Central Lutheran school buys the scrip from Great Lakes Scrip Center and participating local retailers at a discount, and re-sells the certificates to families like yours for full face value. The discount is our school's funds raised. The school receives the funds when the scrip is purchased, not when it is used in the store.

<u>SCRIP CAIP form.</u> If you wish to have a percentage used for tuition of a student at CLS there is a CAIP form available at the CLS office to designate which family is to receive the credit. <u>40% of the percentage</u> given by the business is given to the designated family. If no family is designated the full 60% of the percentage goes to CLS general fund.

Our SCRIP program is maintained by volunteer coordinators. Thousands of dollars pass through our SCRIP program each year because we have phenomenal participation. You can order your SCRIP via a SCRIP order form or you may purchase SCRIP out of the inventory that we have on hand throughout the week. Inventory may be purchased at the school on weekdays or at St. John Lutheran Church (Newhall) or St. Stephen's (Atkins) on Sunday mornings.

Rules:

Teams/Players-

- 1. The tournament has a bracketed 8 team format. Teams are guaranteed 3 games
- 2. Teams will consist of maximum 5 players.

3. Players may be on only one roster

4. Team check-in will take place from 8:00-9:00 a.m. the day of the tournament. Games begin at 9:00am.

Play/Sportsmanship-

- 1. Teams must be at their assigned court at the scheduled game time. A five minute forfeit rule will be enforced.
- 2. All games will start and end with any number of players on the court (1,2,or 3)

3. Initial ball possession will be determined by a coin toss. Jump balls will alternate possession with the loser of the coin toss taking the next possession.

4. Possession will change after each score. After a score, the offensive team must allow the defensive team to "check" the ball at the head of the three point line. Failure to take it back behind the three point line will result in loss of possession and any points scored on that possession.

5. After "checking" the ball, the offensive players must pass the ball to a teammate. You may not dribble the ball into play. First violation will result in a warning. Any future violations will

result in possession changes.

6. When a defensive team gets the ball by either a steal or rebound, they must take the ball back behind the three point line at any point before attacking the basket on offense.

7. There will be no lane violations; no 3 second in the lane.

8. Player substitution is permitted during any dead-ball situation. You do not need to check in at the score table to enter the game.

Each tam will be allowed 1 one minute time-out per game. The clock does not stop running.A time out will not be permitted during the last two minutes of the game.

- 10. Personal fouls will not be tallied so players cannot "foul-out" however each foul with result in a "one and one" unless it is a shooting foul which will result in two free throws.
- 11. All intentional fouls will result in two shots and possession for the other team
- 12. Technical fouls can and will be administered if necessary. A technical foul will result in two shots for the other team from a player of their choice and possession of the ball. One technical foul on a player will result in ejection for the remainder of that game.

Game/Scoring:

5th/6th Brackets

1.Plays to 25 points or 20 minutes whichever comes first.

2. When the 20 minute time limit is reached, the team that is ahead will be declared the winner. If the game is tied, a free throw shoot-out will determine the winner.

7th/8th Brackets

1. Plays to 30 points or 25 minutes whichever comes first.

2. When the 25 minute time limit is reached the team that is ahead will be declared the winner. If the game is tied, a free throw shoot-out will determine the winner.
