Spring Fling Paddle Auction

This year's Spring Fling events will once again include a Paddle Auction. The Paddle Auction will be held during the live auction and offers a chance for supporters to give a monetary donation to one important need in our school. This year, the money will go toward replacing the wireless internet system for the entire building. Our current system was installed 5 years ago. That doesn't seem that long ago, but it's no longer serving our needs. The current system is considered "end of life" and will no longer allow for system updates. Since the system was installed, we've added 30 iPads and 30 chrome books to our school --tying up more and more bandwidth. We are pleased with the solution we have found to replace the wireless system --we just need the funding! If you are unable to attend the Paddle Auction, but would still like to donate towards this need, please contact the school office.

Transportation Reimbursement Forms for 2nd semester are due back in the office by Wednesday, April 26th. The reimbursement form is attached at the end of the correspondent.







FROM THE PRINCIPAL'S DESK

Social Media Rules for Teenagers

The vast majority of teens use social networking sites to communicate with their friends - as well as strangers - on a daily basis. Although social media can offer educational opportunities, it can also be very dangerous. Cyberbullies, sexual predators, catfishers, and scammers prey on unsuspecting teenagers every day. To keep your teen safe, exercise these social media strategies:

- 1. Educate yourself about social media. Develop a clear understanding of what your teen is doing on social media. Educate yourself about various social media sites and know which sites your teen frequents. Learn about the risks each site poses so you can have meaningful conversations with your teen.
- View your teen's privacy settings. Each social media site has different rules about privacy settings. View your teen's privacy settings and discuss the possible implication of making information public. Be aware that some social media sites, such as Tumblr, make it difficult for teens to keep their information private.
- 3. <u>Talk about what's appropriate to share</u>. Engage in frequent conversations about what is appropriate to share on social media and what isn't. Sometimes teens need reminders about the things they should never share on social media. Make it clear that there can be serious ramifications for bullying, making threats, or engaging in sexualized behavior via social media.
- 4. <u>Keep tabs on your teen's social media use</u>. Parents should have access to their teen's social media passwords. Take steps to keep an eye on what your teen is doing on social media.
- 5. <u>Discuss how social media can impact their future</u>. It's important for teens to realize that colleges and future employers are going to be looking at their social media activity. Explain how inappropriate comments and photos can come back to haunt them years later. Make it clear that once something is shared on the internet, it will remain in cyberspace and people may be able to access it forever.
- 6. <u>Set time limits on social media use</u>. It can be easy to lose track of time on the internet, especially when using social media. Take steps to proactively limit your teen's screen time. Most doctors recommend no more than two hours of screen time per day that includes TV!



fast approaching! Here's what you need to know about our PTL's biggest fundraiser, as we answer some FAQs (frequently asked questions, that is).

What's a Spring Fling?

The Spring Fling is a PTL (Parent Teacher League) fundraising event hosted by the 6th grade parents and another class –this year it's 1st grade parents. This group of parents are in charge of organizing the entire event.

What is there to do at this event?

The Spring Fling consists of many different activities that both young and old can enjoy while supporting our school. This year's event will include:

- **FOOD.** A tasty meal consisting of pulled pork sandwiches, hot dogs, baked beans, chips, veggies & dip, homemade cookies & bars, and yummy ice cream. All for a freewill donation!
- CARNIVAL GAMES that the kids (and adults, too) will have a blast trying their luck to win tons of prizes.
- **RAFFLES.** Remember when we asked families to donate items to their children's themed classroom basket? All those items will be packaged up into awesome baskets for a chance to be won by some lucky raffle participant.

Check it out...there could also be other items donated by our supporters waiting to be raffled.

- A SILENT AUCTION with many, many items all donated by businesses and individuals who love to support our school!
- A chance to WIN AN iPad!!! Read on to find out how.
- A LIVE AUCTION with even more items donated by supporters. Find some really unique items here.
- A PADDLE AUCTION that specifically raises money for one really, really important need in our school. More on that later, too.
- SPECIAL CLASSROOM PROJECTS will be a part of the live auction, too. Your heart will melt when you see what your kiddos made at school!

I don't remember this at all last year. Did I miss it?

No. The Spring Fling is so huge, we only have it every other year. The last one was held in 2015.

So, when do all the activities take place?

The fun starts at 4:00 pm on Saturday, April 1st (no foolin') with the carnival games and raffles running until 6:00 pm, and the silent auction and food wrapping up by 6:30 pm. Then, the excitement builds as we find out who wins the iPad (again, keep reading to find out how). The live auction will follow right around 6:45 pm.

What does it cost?

Admission is free. The food is a freewill donation. Tickets for the raffle items and games are \$1 each or 6/\$5. You can also buy a wristband to play unlimited carnival games for \$10 per child.

Does this event go late into the night? My kids will never make it through if it lasts too long.

Fortunately, our expert auctioneer, Dan Kaestner, and his team run things very smoothly and the evening wraps up <u>well</u> before the 10:00 news comes on. And, during the auction, we'll show a movie in the south gym so the kids can wind down and relax if they want.

How do you use the money that is raised?

There are many projects that the PTL supports with their funds. In more recent years, PTL funds have helped us keep up with technology needs! Specifically, PTL has purchased iPads, Chromebooks, Apple TVs for all classrooms, projector screens, software updates, anti-virus protection, laptop batteries, and a whole new library computer system. It doesn't end there. PTL has also helped pay for our Reading & Science Curriculum, uniforms for our show choir, the new Gaga Ball Pit, registration fees for our kids to attend district events, classroom and resource room supplies, field trips....

How much money do you plan to raise?

Our goal is \$25,000.

NONPUBLIC PARENT REIMBURSEMENT REQUEST FORM


