




With the help of an IPAD App, 1st grader Emme Wolf is shown what she might look like in 100 years!!




Kindergartners write to 100, make a paper chain of 100 and decorate 100 Crowns!

FROM THE PRINCIPALS DESK

What Does It Take to Succeed?

As parents, you've probably spent mental time and energy in making sure that your children are set up to succeed in life. You might worry whether other children are better positioned to do well in school, in sports - you name it. But there's good news: your child doesn't have to have a genius IQ score to make a powerful and lasting impact on society. Here are five attributes that you can help nurture in your child's everyday life.

- 1. **Curiosity**. Help your children explore all their interests without fear of failure. Give them access to books, take them to museums, planetariums, and zoos. Importantly, don't force activities or hobbies on them let them find out what they like and cultivate that interest.
- 2. **Devotion to Passion**. Thomas Edison said "genius is 1% inspiration and 99% perspiration." Any child who is truly gifted will possess the ability to work independently and concentrate for a long time on things that interest him. Remember, it takes 10,000 hours of practice to become successful in any field!
- 3. **Persistence vs. Smarts Mind-Set**. As parents one of your most natural instincts is to tell your children that they're smart. And while your intentions are good, this can actually hurt them in the long run. Tell them they are hard-workers, creative, patient, and persistent. Don't allow them to think that being smart means they don't have to work hard.
- 4. **Tolerance for Failure**. The only way for a person to go from good to great is practice. If you find that your child is frustrated by something, try to identify the aspects of his performance that are giving him trouble, help him improve, and encourage him to keep practicing until he gets it right.
- 5. **Self-Control**. No matter how smart we are, if we don't discipline ourselves and resist our desire for instant gratification, we won't get very far. The same is true for your child and that is why it's important to instill early on the importance of waiting for rewards in a variety of situations, so that your child is able to stay focused and persist through challenging circumstances academic or otherwise!

What you've just read is good news - because if one thing is clear, it's that your child doesn't need a 200 IQ to be successful in life. The key is instilling the above traits early on - and nurturing and encouraging them every chance you get.






